

### Advocacy Committee Chair

Linda has a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Mercyhurst University Erie Pennsylvania. She is a graduate student at Argosy University Northern Virginia where she is studying clinical mental health counseling. She has certification in child forensic interviewing, canine management & training, psychopharmacology, and train the trainer dual diagnosis mental health and intellectual disabilities. Linda has completed the Child Welfare Academy training in Pennsylvania, Maryland and Virginia. Linda L Bell has been a Child Protective Services investigator for 16 years. Emerging Leaders and Graduate Student



## What's New?

### MEDICAID COVERAGE FOR ADDICTION RECOVERY EXPANSION ACT



In September the President of MAMCD, Michelle Chaney, reached out in the spirit of advocacy to the office of Senator Benjamin Cardin (MD Dem.) concerning supporting the Medicaid Coverage for Addiction Recovery Expansion Act.

The two issues the president focused on in a conversation with State Director, Carleton Atkinson, was to bring attention to the needs of youth and pregnant women in addiction treatment delivery. She expressed a need for the expansion to assist youth to reduce the rate of detainment and for pregnant women to increase their participation in treatment.

The president expressed the need to recognize these two groups as vulnerable and at risk for being overlooked and their challenges to be underestimated. She was informed that these two groups were not identified in this manner and the State Director mentioned this will be discussed in future meetings with the senator and staff. The State Director requested to be invited to MAMCD scheduled events in the future.



## MAMCD ESTABLISHES ANNUAL AWARDS

The MAMCD Executive Board has established four annual awards. These awards will be presented annually in recognition of members who have contributed extraordinary service to the field of multicultural counseling. Three of the awards are devoted to professionals in the field, and the fourth is scholarship award that will be awarded to a deserving graduate student majoring in counseling with a focus on counseling individual from diverse backgrounds.

The four awards have been named to honor our founding presidents who contributed to the foundation, service and lasting qualities of the organization.

The Dr. Clemmie Solomon Professional Development Award who served as the founding president of MAMCD. The Dr. Carl S. Barham Lifetime Achievement Award who served as the second president. The Dr. Rita L. Robinson Multicultural Counseling Award who served as the fourth president, and The Aaron B. Stills Graduate Scholarship Award who served as the fifth president, and all four of these pioneers were instrumental in establishing the national Association for Multicultural Counseling and Development in 1985.

All four of the awards were presented at the Annual Awards Ceremony at Bowie State University on June 9, 2018 with the nominees being the recipients of the first three awards. The ceremony was well attended by former MAMCD officers, members, students, family and friends. Immediate Past President, Tonya Mackin and the MAMCD Awards Committee indicated that "they are all very proud of the very specific accomplishments of the award recipients, and their expertise in maintaining and expanding the role of multicultural counseling in the state and nation."
